The Mount'N Mover has given individuals with ALS the ability to access computers, iPads, Augmentative change from using a tablet to a camera or computer for recreational enjoyment without the addition of another mount or several components of a mount.

Instead of a caregiver removing the entire mount from a power wheelchair or bed, individuals who are able to use their hand and arm to apply less than 2 pounds of pressure can move the mount away from the communication position to more than one resting position. Those who have used Mount'N Mover products reported enjoying the freedom to independently adjust a mount to a new position.

Consider frequently visited locations—coffee houses, doctors offices, hallways at work or school, elevators, bus or Metro Rail, department store, reception halls, place of worship, etc. All of these environments have space limitations based on location, structural limitations, size, and number of people attending the event. Being able to adjust the mount to a new position prevents accidental message selections on an AAC Device, damage to the mount or an AAC products, and drops from occurring. Those able to use this feature reported enhanced the quality of life and independence.
